**PARK ACTIVITIES**

- Hiking – Unicoi has 8 miles of hiking trails. Information about Unicoi’s self-guided hiking trails is available at the Lodge Front Desk, the Camper Check In, ParkPass booth, and the Visitor’s Center/Trading Post.
- The adjacent U.S.F.S. Smith Creek Trail is 4.8 miles one way, 9.6 miles round-trip; Shuttle Service is not provided.
- Picnicking – there are 6 different picnic shelters and various picnic tables with grills along Anna Ruby Falls Road
- Swimming (see Beach Information)
- Fishing - trout stream, lake, & wheelchair accessible dock
- Mountain Biking – Unicoi has a 7.5 mile mountain bike trail
- Pedal boat and canoe rentals (seasonal)
- Playgrounds – There are 3 playgrounds located at the Lodge, Shelter # 6, and in the campground near the Visitor’s Center/Trading Post.

**PARK PROGRAMS**

The Programming Department at Unicoi offers year-round activities to Park and Lodge visitors. These programs range from daily summer activities and weekend programs to the large Special Events. The public programs are all free and open to the public. The programs vary from recreational, cultural, environmental education, historical, crafts, or just for fun!
